## **I've Registered for the November 4<sup>th</sup> Elections – Who Am I Voting For?**

So you are registered to vote in the upcoming November 4<sup>th</sup> elections and ready to use your vote to build influence and power for Koreans -- congratulations! So now you have to decide who to vote for. We at Asian Americans Advancing Justice can't tell you who to vote for, but can tell you to vote for people who support the issues most important to you and your family. If they are already politicians, see how they've voted on those issues. Do you care about changing our federal immigration laws? You can look up how your Congressman voted. Do you care about funding for public schools in Georgia? You can find out whether your state elected official voted for or against funding. Some major races for the Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> election include the race for Georgia Governor (Nathan Deal vs. Jason Carter), U.S. Senate (Michelle Nunn vs. David Perdue), State Superintendent (Valarie Wilson vs. Richard Woods), and many state and county officials.
